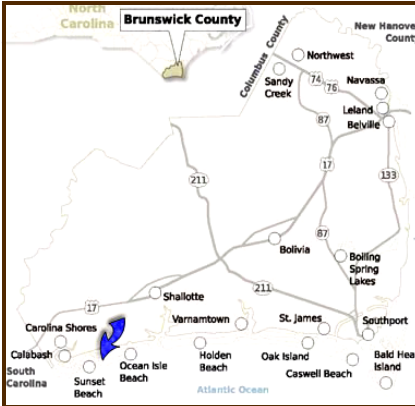


Sunset Beach, North Carolina



Sunset Beach, at just about 3 miles in length, is the smallest of Brunswick County's barrier islands. It is also the southernmost beach in North Carolina. With a population of around 1800, the majority of people reside in mainland golf course communities. Full-time residents on the island number about 100.

Amenities on the island are sparse, but across the bridge there are numerous dining options, grocery and retail stores, first-rate medical facilities, championship golf courses, museums and a planetarium. The seafood haven of Calabash is less than five miles away. Ocean Isle is about seven and the entertainment venues of North Myrtle Beach are about a 15-minute drive from the bridge. Sunset Beach is also just 45 minutes from the charming port cities of Southport and Wilmington, and the exciting playground of Myrtle Beach, South Carolina.

Next to Sunset Beach is a 1300 acre state preserve known as Bird Island, which is accessible by wading from the southern tip of Sunset Beach when the tide is out, or by boat. This unadulterated setting is a natural habitat and nesting ground for the abundant coastal wildlife, including the endangered Loggerhead Sea Turtle and beloved Wood Storks. One can walk from the public parking area and gazebo at Sunset Beach, along the Bird Island beachfront, all the way to South Carolina.

With a combination of rustic charm and a pristine waterfront, Sunset Beach remains a jewel in the eye of those who cherish nature.
